We were overwhelmed by the energy and gifts that filled the sanctuary and hallways of the church.

Michele Villarreal joined us from the Dallas office of the International Rescue Committee, where she is Development and External Relations Coordinator. She spoke briefly, but movingly, about her work. Based on her close interactions with hundreds of refugees, including those from the Syrian conflict, she said she has never had reason to fear any of the people she has picked up at DFW, even in the middle of the night; hers is one of the first American faces they see. What all the refugees have in common, she said, is a desire to get their kids into school after years of interruption of their educations by the civil war.

Our \$6,000-plus total does not include a few auction items yet to be picked up from the church office (and a few are still in the hall to bid on tonight) or gifts made directly to the IRC (click here to donate).
