Daily, 22 vets daily commit suicide. Suicide is the third leading cause of death for ages 12-24 and second leading cause of death for ages 65-75. Bread for the World's 2017 Offering of Letters

Each year Bread for the World urges elected leaders in Washington, D.C., to enable people in our nation and our world to feed their families and move out of poverty.
