Trinity Sunday

The text of the choral anthem on June 11 was a translation of the Gaelic fifth century poem of affirmation, "St. Patrick's Lorica," written by Patrick himself. A"lorica" is a tunic with mystical protective qualities, used to ward off evil charms, demons and banshees in the Irish pagan tradition; the modern translation is "breastplate," as in a piece of armor.

Hundreds of churches in New York City chose this piece as the processional hymn for the second Sunday after 9/11 (it took that long to organize after the attacks) in defiance against the violence, in embracing of Christ's charge to love one another, and, in affirmation of the strong Trinity.

Christ be with me, Christ within me, Christ behind me, Christ before me, Christ beside me, Christ to win me, Christ to comfort and restore me. Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ in quiet, Christ in danger, Christ in hearts of all that love me, Christ in mouth of friend and stranger.

I bind unto myself the Name, The strong Name of the Trinity, By invocation of the same, The Three in One and One in Three. By Whom all nature hath creation, Eternal Creator, Spirit, Word: Praise to the Lord of my salvation, Salvation is of Christ the Lord.

We would love for you to be a part of the work that God is doing in China in whatever way you are able! 
