The Ordination of Andy Stubblefield to the Gospel Ministry

Tuesday, August 1 5:00 p.m. at Lake Shore reception following

Andy has met with a discernment committee of Lake Shore members and with an ordination council composed of Lake Shore members, staff, and other clergy from the Waco area. He would be honored for the Lake Shore community to participate in this important marker in his spiritual journey, affirming the ministry to which he is called.

Andy was born and raised in Pensacola, FL. He graduated from Mississippi College in Clinton, Mississippi, in 2008. After college he spent a year as a ski burn at Lake Tahoe before he entered the Peace Corps. Andy served for three years in Uzhorod, Ukraine, as an English Teacher and Certification Specialist for Ukrainian Teachers. He returned in December 2013 to thaw out in Texas and to study at Truett Seminary. Andy graduated with his M. Div. in December 2015, walking proudly with his sister and brother-in-law, Claire and Zach Helton.

After graduating from Truett, he took a job as a hospice chaplain. Unbeknownst to him, it would be a transformative experience with consistent affirmations by mentors, colleagues, patients, and friends. He has found a vocation that allows him to fully give of himself and his gifts while also feeling completely fulfilled in that work. During the last year and half, Andy has had the opportunity to lead two grief support groups at Lake Shore. He says, "It is such an honor to be able to join people in their stories of grief and walk alongside them. Lake Shore provided me with the opportunity to do that."

The last year and a half has shaped his journey in so many ways. It has set Andy and his wife, Meg, on a different trajectory than they ever expected. Their journey is now taking them to Pensacola, FL, where Andy has accepted a job at Baptist Hospital as a Resident Chaplain, and Meg will be working as a Legal Assistant for a law firm in Pensacola. They move on from Waco and the Lake Shore community excited, yet with heavy hearts at the loss of a beautiful, authentic, welcoming and affirming community of people. Andy says, "You have each, in large and small ways, become figures in our stories. We look forward to many return trips (to see new and older nephews and many friends) and to continue sharing our journeys with you."

At the same time as these events began to manifest, Andy began having conversations with Kyndall about ordination. In his words, "The experiences in hospice chaplaincy and the opportunities to lead grief support groups have only solidified my understanding of my calling. The Lake Shore community has been so influential in the formulation of that calling. I asked Kyndall if the Lake Shore community would be willing to ordain me." Our ordaining Andy will be a statement of affirmation of the work he has done and the work he moves forward to do.
