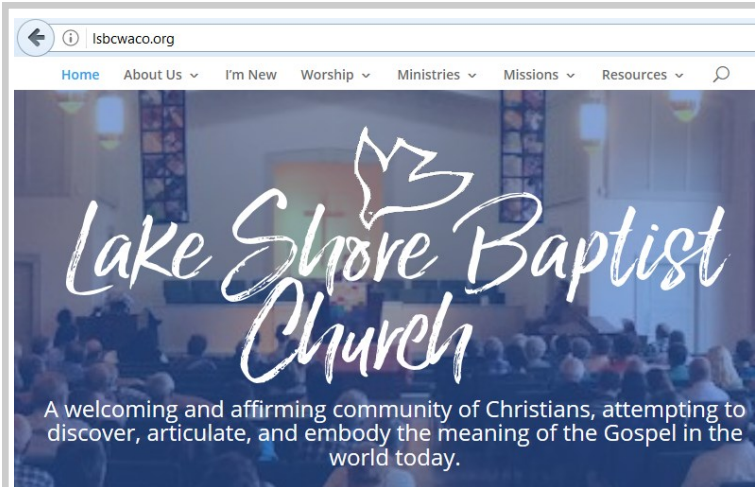

In order to raise money to cover youth camp scholarships, the Lake Shore youth will host a storytelling competition on September 6. ## Lake Shore — an Encourager Church

CBF Encourager Churches are a crucial component to the work of CBF field personnel around the world. Such relationships invite churches into a unique and intimate role in missions and unite churches with the ongoing mission work in CBF's three contexts: global poverty, global migration and the global church. It brings churches into the historic role of sending members of its body into the world as we cultivate beloved community, bear witness to Jesus Christ, and seek transformational development.



A congregation becomes an Encourager Church when it formalizes its relationship with specific field personnel. There is flexibility in this program where churches can shape the details of the partnership to best fit their needs and the needs of the field personnel with whom they partner. CBF suggests that Encourager Churches include four encouragement areas: prayer support, program support, short-term engagement, and financial support.

Our Global Missions Covenant Group recommended to the deacons that Lake Shore enter into an Encourager Church relationship with Brittany and Casey Ramirez, who will soon leave for China with their daughter, Juniper. We look forward to the new things God will do in their lives and in the life of Lake Shore as we enter more deeply into this expression of global community, alongside the Chinese church.

## Community through Caring

Our care groups have been reorganized into 8 "community through caring (CTC)" groups. Everyone has been assigned a group.

The CTC groups main goals are to:

- create ways to build community with each other
- care for each other in times of need and celebrate good news together
- communicate needs with each other, the staff and with the church at large

Meet your group at a lunch after worship in September. To accommodate large groups by offering enough space, half the groups are meeting on each of two Sundays. Four groups will meet on September 10 and four, on September 17.

- (1) Meat: Ham OR Roasted Turkey Breast sandwich, chips, pickle and a chocolate chip cookie
- (2) Vegetarian (spinach veggie wrap), chips, pickle, and a chocolate chip cookie
- (3) Gluten-free (ham or turkey, lettuce, tomato on gluten free bun, chips, pickle, gluten-free snickerdoodle cookie

*We sent the following information in an email to everyone on our Waco email list. If you would like to help, please bring items today.*

Highland Baptist is loading an 18-wheeler with supplies to take to Houston on Thursday at 10:00 a.m. We have already had other suggestions from church members for ways to help, and we will pass them along to you. In the next weeks and months we will hear of countless needs and assess how we can help. This is something we can do RIGHT NOW as we are seeing the impact of the storm hour by hour.

Highland is partnering with larger relief organizations. Each church that is a collection point has been given a very specific list of supplies to send to Houston. Donations will be delivered to First Baptist Church, Houston, which has been designated as a staging site for supplies. At this time, Lake Shore needs to collect and send *only the items listed below*. As Highland's pastor John Durham said, "When the [Waco] truck arrives, they will know exactly what's in it."

## Time and places to take supplies:

Highland is accepting supplies today (Wednesday) at 3014 Maple, 9am-5pm in the Life Center. Come to Door C which is at the Green Parking lot. The church welcome volunteers to help with sorting. **Lake Shore will collect items today (Wednesday) until 4:00 in the upstairs hallway.**

## List of supplies for Thursday's truck to Houston (other items will not be accepted at this time):

- Bed sheets for all size beds
- Very slightly worn clothing
- Bleach
- Personal toiletries and hygiene items (toothpaste, toothbrushes, soap, shampoo, razors, feminine hygiene products). **Bag similar items together. You may want to buy in one item bulk instead of a variety of items to make distribution easier)**
- Large plastic containers and boxes of large garbage bags.**

Again, we will have opportunities to give in so many ways through the next weeks, months, years as we see how needs develop. This is one way to help today.
