Community through Caring lunches after worship September 10 and 17

Remembering Dave Kopplin

Garrison Keillor said, “Thank you, God, for this good life and forgive us if we do not love it enough.” Another kind soul from the upper Midwest, Dave Kopplin, showed us how much he loved life. And through him, many of us at Lake Shore learned to love it more. Dave lived each day with quiet wisdom, dignity and purpose. At Lake Shore he modeled respect for others and love for our neighbors and our families. No matter what meeting he was in, Dave showed us that attention to details, good listening and good questions guide us toward good decisions.

Dave and Faith joined Lake Shore in 1980. They soon became part of a “supper club” where Faith and Dave formed friendships that have lasted for years.

In the early 1980s the Kopplins led a youth Sunday School class and a young married adult Sunday School class. An ordained Lutheran minister, Dave preached for us several times on Reformation Sunday.



Dave was one of the first former associate members to be ordained as a deacon. Even before his retirement, Dave led our congregation in countless ways, including serving as Chair of

the Music Committee and Chair of the Committee on Committees. Until just a few weeks ago, he was serving as a deacon and as a member of the Personnel Committee.

For many years Faith and Dave volunteered with the Family Self-Sufficiency program, helping prepare and serve supper to our guests from the Waco Housing Authority’s program one Thursday night each month. He participated in Missions Table meetings, representing Planned Parenthood.

Dave is the one who initiated our advertising with KWBU (Waco’s NPR) — first for the church and then adding the Children’s Center to our publicity last year.

Since his retirement, Dave has devoted countless hours to the Lake Shore Baptist Children’s Center. As Naomi Fox wrote this week: “When Dave joined the Children’s Center Board he did not know of the need for financial oversight, but when he saw the need, he went to work. . . . Overseeing a lot of our Center’s operations was a very time-consuming commitment that Dave took on over the last decade of his life and he worked so very hard to assure that the mission of our Center was fulfilled. He was a precious gift to our Center and our church.” *(More about this part of his legacy in next week’s newsletter.)*

Dave reflected God’s love by loving others. May we remember him by loving this good life.
