Wednesday night seminar

Rev. Dr. Jann Aldredge-Clanton will illustrate intersectional feminism through hymns that connect gender equality, racial

equality, economic justice, caring for creation, and other justice concerns. She says, “Words we sing in worship have power to shape our beliefs and actions because the music embeds the words in our memories. In this seminar we’ll experience music that names Deity as female and male and more to support the foundational biblical truth that all people are created equally in the divine image (Genesis 1:27) and to contribute to justice and peace.”

Jann is an ordained Baptist minister, author, teacher, and chaplain. She currently serves as co-chair of Equity for Women in the Church, on the council of Evangelical & Ecumenical Women’s Caucus-Christian Feminism Today (EEWC-CWT), and as adjunct professor at Richland College, Dallas, Texas. Her work focuses on feminist theology and inclusive liturgy. Her published books include *She Lives! Sophia Wisdom Works in the World*; *Inclusive Hymns for Liberating Christians*; *Inclusive Hymns for Liberation, Peace, and Justice*; *Earth Transformed with Music! Inclusive Songs for Worship*; *Seeking Wisdom: Inclusive Blessings and Prayers for Public Occasions*; *Breaking Free: The Story of a Feminist Baptist Minister*; *In Search of the Christ-Sophia: An Inclusive Christology for Liberating Christians*; *Imagine God! A Children’s Musical Exploring and Expressing Images of God*; *In Whose Image? God and Gender*; *Praying with Christ-Sophia: Services for Healing and Renewal*; *Counseling People with Cancer*; *God, A Word for Girls and Boys*.
