Rev. Dr. Jann Aldredge-Clanton will illustrate intersectional feminism through hymns that connect gender equality, racial equality, economic justice, caring for creation, and other justice concerns. She says, "Words we sing in worship have power to shape our beliefs and actions because the music embeds the words in our memories. In this seminar we'll experience music that names Deity as female and male and more to support the foundational biblical truth that all people are created equally in the divine image (Genesis 1:27) and to contribute to justice and peace." Jann is an ordained Baptist minister, author, teacher, and chaplain. She currently serves as adjunct professor at Richland College, Dallas, Texas. She also writes a blog.

We'll be working from about 9am-4pm each day with a lunch break, and after that we'll clean up, grab dinner, pray together, and enjoy some free time together. We leave Friday, Oct 6th at 5:30pm. There will be pizza in the Teen House, so please arrive closer to 5pm so you have time to eat. We return Sunday, Oct 8th in the evening. We will be staying at Baptist Temple (CBF asked us to change this week), which has shower units, but no kitchen, so please disregard our request for frozen foods!

Louis Garcia, who is on the board of directors at Mission Waco, and Martie Sauter, who works in


Jubilee Market, have arranged for Mission Waco leadership to tell us about the vision of Mission Waco for the next 25 years.
