In just four short lines, Madeleine L'Engle's elegant little poem "After Annunciation" captures the depth of the Advent and Christmas season:

This is the irrational season
When love blooms bright and wild.
Had Mary been filled with reason
There'd have been no room for the child.

God's vulnerable, unconditional love plunges us into the "irrational season" –love which bridged the span

from heaven to earth to become flesh and dwell among us; love that staggers under its own splendor; love which finds its strength in its willingness to be weak; love that named Mary its midwife.

Nothing about the Advent season is rational, reasonable, or logical. We bypass common sense to deck our church with rich velvet banners. We play music that has the power to evoke memories of comforting familiarity and profound tears. We light a circle of purple candles to mark our steady approach to Christmas during four weeks of otherwise dizzying activity. All these are markers, announcing that we believe in a God who ever and always speaks the unlikely poetry of the imaginative possibility of the birth of new life into our world.

Lake Shore writers have paid attention to the irrational signs of incarnation in this season. They have pondered the merciful irrationality they see in the nativity story, as well as in the stories written through the experiences of their lives. They have contributed their thoughts to our booklet as a gift of meditations for you to read each day of the season.

Before you read each mediation, I suggest you read Madeleine L'Engles 4 lines again, for they are a guiding light to each writer's words:

This is the irrational season When love blooms bright and wild. Had Mary been filled with reason There'd have been no room for the child.

Along the way to Christ's birth, your mind and heart may be tipped off balance a little; but that's all right . . . sometimes the paths to finding God are more winding – and more wondrous – than we anticipate. May this Advent season be a transforming one for you, in which the orderly, rational ways of the world are turned upside down by God's grace and joy and bright, wild love.

Advent Missions Tree

Every year we decorate two trees — the Chrismon ("Christ monograms") Tree in our sanctuary and the Missions Tree in our hall. On Wednesday, November 29, more than a hundred Christmas ornaments will hang on the Missions Tree. Projects that will benefit ministries in Waco and around the world were suggested by community agencies with which we interact and by our global contacts in Turkey, Lebanon, Cameroon, Ghana, (Chengdu) China, as well as the CBF ministries in Houston where our church group worked in October. Attached to each ornament is a description of a missions project.

Stop by the tree before or after supper on Wednesday and choose a project you want to do this Advent season. Sign the numbered logo tag that says "the Irrational Season" and place it in the basket on the table. Please note that an ornament with a pink ribbon denotes that it is a child-friendly project.

On the first Wednesday and Sunday of Advent, please choose only one ornament, so that everyone will have a chance to get one. You may select additional ornaments during the following Wednesdays and Sundays.

This year's ornaments

Once again this year, our ornaments were purchased at Mission Waco's World Cup Fair Trade Market. A portion of the cost of each ornament on our Missions Tree will go to the artisans who made them through Maisha Store in Kenya. Maisha's mission is to help alter systems and cycles that propagate poverty and economic disparity around the world. Maisha believes that socially-conscious industry holds the key to permanent change. When craft items are purchased, the profits flow directly back to the artisans, helping them make changes for good.

Four kinds of grass ornaments are on our tree: some with flutes, some with harps, some with stars, some in postures of prayer. Choose one with a missions project to take home.



Community Missions Projects

Here are a few examples of ornaments:

The Cove

The Cove seeks to give youth experiencing homelessness a safe place to thrive.

 Provide boxes of individually packaged snacks for the homeless teens who study and eat at The Cove.

Family Abuse Center

The purpose of the center is to minister to women and children who have suffered physical abuse.

- Buy a board game for children 12 and younger who are living temporarily at the center.
- Give a set of bed pillows for a client who is moving to a new home.

Lake Shore Baptist Children's Center

Our center is a source of nurture and preschool education and a steady place in the lives of working families.

- Give board books suitable for infants ages 6 to 18 months.
- Give a Fisher Price Shape Sorter and animal figures.

Meals & Wheels

In our church kitchen we package and deliver meals to more than fifty individuals three days a week as we partner with Meals and Wheels to help meet the needs of older adults.

Provide funds for a portable electric heater for a MOW client.

Mission Waco/Mission World

Mission Waco's purpose is to provide a holistic relation-based ministry with the poor and marginalized in inner-city Waco, as well as throughout the world, including Church Under the Bridge and the Meyer Center.

- Pack a hygiene kit for a homeless man.
- Pack a hygiene kit for a homeless woman.

Talitha Koum Institute

TKI is a faith-based organization, and, using research-based therapeutic intervention, TKI partners with parents to raise children who are intellectually capable, emotionally resilient, and prepared to be contributing members of the community.

- Give various sizes of kids' playground balls.
- Give washable tempera paints.

Waco Habitat for Humanity

Waco Habitat is an ecumenical Christian housing ministry, helping to eliminate substandard and poverty housing in Waco.

 Provide a toolbox with some basic tools for a new WHFH homeowner family. Provide a Bible for a family.

Waco Immigration Alliance

The Waco Immigration Alliance is a volunteer community group that seeks to make Waco a welcoming place, inclusive of every faith, nationality, and legal status

 Give a \$40 UPS or Office Depot gift card to enable the organization to print, make copies, or purchase office supplies.

Global Missions Projects

Shalom Children's Centre, Ghana

With Lake Shore's support, Christiana Owusu started a preschool in Ghana. Now in its thirteenth year, Shalom feeds and educates more than 300 children in Twifu-Hemang, a rural village in Ghana. Most parents can afford to pay only part of the cost for a child.

- Give \$12 to help pay for school uniforms.
- Give \$30 per chair to help furnish classrooms.

Lebanese Society for Educational & Social Development

In 2015 Lake Shore's Soup Supper benefitted Syrian refugees, and we have maintained a relationship with this Lebanese Baptist ministry. LSESD's mission is "to serve the church in the Arab world through spiritual, social and educational development."

 Give \$50 or more to help LSESD provide a Christmas meal event for Syrian refugee children at a church in the Anjar, Bekaa region of Lebanon. The funds will help provide transportation, a hot meal, a gift for the child, and 2 blankets for the child's family.

Mission Waco/Mission World

This micro-credit program in Haiti provides low interest loans, with weekly meetings for stability, accountability, and community to endure life.

- Give \$50 or more to support Mission Waco
- Mission World's Women's Micro Credit program that empowers and encourages women in Haiti through training in business, prayer, a relationship with God and others

Nsam Baptist, Church, Nsam, Cameroon

This is Henry Kari's home church. It is not only a place for worship, but it is a sanctuary for the village, offering a safe place when groups, Christians and Muslims alike, gather to discuss matters of importance to all the people of Nsam. The holes in the roof have been damaged by years of successive storms, putting the physical foundation at risk.

 Give \$50 or more to repair the roof on Nsam Baptist Church.

CBF, Hurricane Harvey Relief, South Houston

In October Lake Shore members spent a week assisting CBF missionaries Butch and Nell Green in the recovery efforts following Hurricane Harvey. Their work continues.

- Give a \$50 Home Depot or Lowe's gift card to purchase five sheets of drywall (½ in. x 4ft. x 8ft.) to be used for Hurricane Harvey repair and recovery work in South Houston
- Give a \$50 Home Depot or Lowe's gift card to purchase three buckets of All Purpose 4.5 gal. Pre-Mixed Joint Compound to be used for Hurricane Harvey repair and recovery work in South Houston

CBF, Chengdu, China

- Give \$50 or more to purchase Chinese language Bibles for the new church that Casey and Brittany are helping to start in Chengdu
- Give \$30 or more to purchase chairs (\$30 each) for the new church that Casey and Brittany are helping to start in Chengdu
- Give \$50 or more to purchase Chinese language Bibles for the new church that Casey and Brittany are helping start in Chengdu

CBF, Middle East

Refugees are starting small businesses, with the guidance and assistance of CBF missionaries.
