

The Irrational Season

While thinking about this upcoming "irrational season" of advent, I am reminded of how irrational our decision to move to China seems to so many, especially those outside of our faith. When preparing to come, people would ask how long our trip to China would be, and after I tell them, "Well, we hope for at least the next 20 years," they are astonished. It does not make any sense. Why would we leave the comforts and safety of our home and family? It is interesting to see the different responses, some so surprised and confused by something that seems so natural to us.

But that is the neat thing. To me, it seems so strange *not* to leave. We have felt this tug on our hearts for the nations for so long. And the thought of a life *not* lived in China seems so unnatural to me. Trying to imagine a different life for Casey, Juniper, and me seems so wrong.

It makes me wonder about how Mary felt about the

unreasonable thing she was a part of, the incarnation of God among us. Had Mary been reasonable, how would she have responded to that angel bringing her the news that she would carry our Savior.? She responds to the angel, "Let it be to me, as you have said." Had she, too, felt a special tug and calling her entire life and was just waiting for that strange message from the angel? Could she have imagined the confusion, rejection, and pain that would come from her calling? Did she know the absolute joy and honor she would experience from being the mother of Jesus?

It is helpful to think of this right now, as we have just arrived in China, this place we have been journeying to for so long. And while our calling to this place seems so natural, it is not always easy. But what a joy to be a part of the incarnation of God here in this place. What an honor to get to share in this news of our Savior with so many who have never heard. And oh, the joy of knowing that the journey continues! We get to dig deeper into the good news of our Savior. We get to walk on in our calling and see what other irrational and beautiful things God has called us to.
