
"A Way Other Than Our Own"

A Devotional Guide for Lent (\$5.00 in church office) and seminars during Lent

Wednesdays at 6:15 February 21-28 — Bill Bellinger

We're glad that so many of you have picked up a copy of the book we have chosen for Lent this year!

As the editor of the book writes: "Prolonged exposure to Walter's work performs a kind of alchemy on the soul, gradually transforming our cramped and



sclerotic vision into something more capacious and generous. He is an excellent, if occasionally disruptive, companion for the Lenten journey. Walter's incisive exploration of Scripture reveals the same prophetic message found in Isaiah and Jeremiah, calling to us also through the Psalms, Torah, gospels, and even a handful of epistles. We are invited to walk a Lenten path that may be barely recognizable to our self-indulgent and violent world—a path marked by grace, compassion, and abundance."

This week, seven days after Ash Wednesday, we will be entering the second week of Lent, and Bill Bellinger will introduce us to his friend Walter Bruggemann and guide us through Bruggemann's words for the second week of Lent.

Bill is the is the W. Marshall and Lulie Craig Chairholder in Bible, Chair of the Department of Religion and Professor of Religion at Baylor University. He is best known for his research on worship texts in the Old Testament. Bill is the author of Psalms: A Guide to Studying the Psalter, 2nd edition, and Psalmody and Prophecy, and Psalms (with Walter Bruggemann), and among other books. Bill has chaired the Steering Committee for the Book of Psalms Section of the Society of Biblical Literature and has served on the editorial board of the Catholic Biblical Quarterly. A Case Against Hunger

- Children may purchase macaroni & cheese by the box rather than by the case.
- After March 14, Caritas will pick up the food Lake Shore has purchased to help fill the shelves.



The Mission of Caritas is "to provide urgent support to people in need in our community through emergency assistance with food, prescription drugs, clothing, household items and utilities and through two thrift stores." Last year Caritas served 24,000 people with supplemental food assistance.

and author of Blessed and Everything Happens for a Reason (and other lies I've loved), published on February 8, speaking at 10:00 a.m.- noon Wednesday, March 7 in room 107, George W. Truett Theological Seminary.

Exactly two weeks ago yesterday, I read about Kate Bowler's new book. You've probably heard of it by now, too. I ordered it from Amazon the next day, read half of it on Thursday night and the other half on Friday; watched a video of Amy Butler's interview with Kate Bowler at Riverside; read two articles she had written for The New York Times (click here for the first and second article); and listened to Terri Gross interview her on Fresh Air on last Monday. I don't know when I've been so "taken" with the way a writer has told her story. Bowler's first book, Blessed, focused on the prosperity gospel. In her second book, published three years after she was unexpectedly diagnosed with Stage IV incurable cancer at age 35, she writes about the irony of being an expert in health, wealth and happiness while being ill. She tells the story of her struggle to understand the personal and intellectual dimensions of the American belief that all tragedies are tests of character.
