### Dedication of Lake Shore's Little Free Library

Wednesday, April 18 6:15 p.m. (after supper) front lawn of the church

Lake Shore now has a "Little Free Library," as members have noticed; it appears permanently mounted in the front yard of the church, and looks like a birdhouse for giant robins.

"Little Free Libraries"—now a world-wide presence—were begun in 2009 by Todd H. Bol. He simply wanted to make it easy for people to get and read books. The idea is for patrons to take a book, read it, and bring it back-or, truthfully, simply to take a book and read it.

The idea "went viral," as modern youth



put it; over ten appear in the Waco area. According to the LFL list of "Frequently Asked Questions," as of November 2016 there were over 50,000 registered Little Free Library book exchanges in all 50 U.S. states and over 70 countries around the world.

Our library has three stewards, though most have only one; the three are Zach Wilson, Molly Hepp, and Isabelle Murphy. The intent is to offer a service to our neighborhood, including Mountainview School. Books for children, teens, and older neighbors (and Lake Shore members of all three persuasions) will appear there.

Lake Shore has only limited storage for books, and cannot take on the task of storing them all. Zach, Molly, and Isabelle will monitor the limited store of books the church CAN share; please check with any one of them to find when, and whether, you can add to that store.
