### "Child Refugees from Central America's Northern Triangle"

led by Victor Hinojosa Wednesday, May 23, 6:15 p.m.



Victor Hinojosa, Associate Professor of Political Science in the Honors Program at Baylor, will join us to discuss the crisis of the "unaccompanied minors" –

child refugees from Central America's Northern Triangle of Guatemala, Honduras, and El Salvador. These children began arriving in the U.S. in record numbers in 2014 and continue to make the perilous journey north. The UN High Commissioner for Refugees reports that the majority of these children have refugee or asylum claims and are fleeing record levels of violence in their home countries. They are victimized and exploited at every point in their journey and face daunting challenges upon arrival in the U.S. Victor has been leading a project at Baylor to address various aspects of this crisis. #### Sponsoring the Network of **Affirming Baptists** at CBF Annual Gathering

On Sunday night, the deacons approved a request we have received to help sponsor the Affirming Network Breakfast on June 14 at 7:00 a.m. at this year's Cooperative Baptist Fellowship's Annual Gathering at he Hyatt Regency in downtown Dallas.. Since this is not a budgeted item, we will be accepting individual donations. This is a great opportunity to send our funds to denominational efforts that align with our values. Let me tell you a bit more about the breakfast:

Until recently, CBF's hiring policy prohibited "the purposeful hiring of a staff person or the sending of a missionary who is a practicing homosexual." This policy applied to persons directly hired by CBF, but congregations were free to hire who they wanted.

For the past two years, the Illumination Project Committee studied the CBF hiring policy and surveyed CBF churches across the country. Their final recommendation, which was approved by the Governing Board, was two-fold.

First, the Illumination Committee wrote a new hiring policy that eliminated the previous discriminatory language. (You can read the new policy at illumination project.net.)

Second, the Illumination Committee also recommended an "implementation procedure" which states, "Among other qualifying factors, CBF will employ persons for leadership positions in ministry who exhibit the ideals set forth in our hiring policy, have gifts appropriate to the particular position and who practice a traditional Christian sexual ethic of celibacy in singleness or faithfulness in marriage between a woman and a man." In other words, CBF may hire gay people for lower level positions but not for leadership or missions positions.

Many people within the life of CBF are working to fight against the discriminatory nature of the implementation plan. Nathan Russell, a gay Christian who works at Brite Divinity School and is a member of Broadway Baptist Church, has formed a Network of Affirming Baptists who will meet for breakfast at CBF's General Assembly. The breakfast is in the same building as the conference, making it an important, visible event in the life of CBF.

# In Memoriam: David Ryals

Cyndi Williams Moore and Becky Ryals wrote the following remembrance of former Lake Shore member David Ryals for the church family after his death last week.

David Ryals, a charter member of Lake Shore, passed away Monday, May 7, in Austin. He was suffering from pancreatic cancer and fought bravely to beat it so that he and his wife, Becky, could celebrate their 40th anniversary together on September 1.

David was reared from age 2 by his sister and brother-in-law, Jean and George Williams, who were charter members that helped build Lake Shore. He is predeceased by Jean and George and a sister, Kerry Williams Creech. He is survived by his sister, Cyndi Williams Moore (Steve) of Little Rock, three children and their spouses, five grandchildren, and many nieces, nephews and cousins.
