


Summer Sabbath

Northern Triangle Tour June 28, 6pm-7:30pm

In 2014, more than 68,000 unaccompanied children were apprehended on the U.S./Mexico border, double the number from the previous year. Of this group, the majority are from the Central American countries of El Salvador, Guatemala, and Honduras. Known as the Northern Triangle, this region has a long and complicated relationship with the United States.

Northern Triangle is an exhibition at the Mayborn Museum this summer. It was created by Borderland Collective, opening a space for constructive dialogue and exchange around the current Central American refugee crisis along the U.S./ Mexico border.

Last week when Victor Hinojosa was our guest seminar leader, we asked him if he would be willing to arrange a tour of the exhibit for us on a Thursday night, the evening the museum is open late. He said he would welcome the opportunity. Cost is \$8 for adults, \$7 for seniors, and \$5 for children 2-12.

Summer meals for Waco students



2.8 million Texas students qualify to receive free or reducedprice breakfast and lunch at school. Students often go without consistent meals during the summer break. The Summer Meals Program of the Texas Hunger Initiative provides access to free meals for children (18 and under).

Craig Nash of THI told us about Red Oak, an apartment community that needs help this summer. It is a mixed-income property with a built-in summer and afterschool program (New Life Alliance). Because of their relatively remote location and small numbers of kids they serve (around 20), the school district can't serve them summer meals. They are looking for some help with shelf-stable food items that can be used to make meals for their summer program.

We hope you will pick up some items to fill their shelves and place them in the basket at the front door of the sanctuary through the summer. Think in terms of bringing enough for one meal for twenty children. Here are some ideas:

cereal, applesauce
pasta and spaghetti sauce
two loaves of bread and canned tuna
a bag of beans, a bag of rice, and tortillas
pancake mix and syrup
crackers and almond butter (no peanut butter), jelly

Shalom Children's Center

One of our global missions partners is Shalom

Children's Center in Twifu, Hemang, Ghana, founded by Christiana Owusu and Lake Shore Baptist Church fifteen years ago. Christiana's family members, among others in the village, were instrumental in offering their gifts



to build and maintain the school and gave immeasurable help in the time since. Victor, her brother, was a mechanic who lived in Accra, the capital. He keep the bus going by making needed repairs and replacing tires. Her sister Adjuwa cooked the meals for the children every day in a huge pot over an open fire before the kitchen/cantina was created a few years ago. Both Victor and Adjuwa have died in the last year. We are grateful for them and for the dedication with which they served the mission of Shalom and the value they, too, saw in providing a school that provides not only educational instruction and religious education for several hundred boys and girls in a safe environment but also a uniform and two meals each day.

If you would like to help support Shalom, your gift of \$120 will supplement the meager earnings that many of the parents contribute; most of them, subsistence farmers, contribute toward their children's education; help provide teachers with monthly salaries; and complement the grant from the Alliance of Baptists that has provided funds for projects such as floor tile for the cantina and a new pump for the well.
