Kurt Kaiser, Guest Musician on Sunday, July 15

Kurt Kaiser, a member of DaySpring Baptist Church and a vital member of the Waco community, spent his early days in Chicago. At the age of 12, he began playing for live radio. Kurt was heavily influenced by jazz, which facilitated his ability to improvise. He studied at the American Conservatory of Music in Chicago and earned two degrees from Northwestern University.



The Kaisers moved to Waco in 1959 to join Jarrell McCracken's Christian music company, Word, Inc. Kurt became director of artists and repertoire, later becoming vice-president and director of music for Word. He has more than 300 copyrighted songs to his name, including "Pass It On" from the Christian musical *Tell It Like It Is* and "Oh, How He Loves You and Me."

He has arranged and produced albums for many gifted artists, among them Kathleen Battle, Tennessee Ernie Ford, Hale & Wilder, Jerome Hines, Burl Ives, Ken Medema, Christopher Parkening, Joni Eareckson Tada, Ethel Waters, Anne Martindale Williams, Christopher Adkins and many others. He appeared in a concert with Cliff Barrows and, many times during a thirty-year period, with George Beverly Shea.

Kaiser became a master at matching singers with the right tunes. "I know what singers like to sing, what kinds of swoops they like to take, what kind of lyrics they like, and I learned a lot of that at word...I love matching their personality to their music."

The numerous awards he has been presented include the Lifetime Achievement Award from the American Society of Composers, Authors and Publishers; membership in the Gospel Music Hall of Fame; a Dove award for his piano album *Psalms, Hymns, and Spiritual Songs*. Kurt loves his continuing involvement in music and still has a passion for a beautiful melody.

They are looking for some help with shelf-stable food items that can be used to make meals for the summer program.
