This summer we have been helping Red Oak, an apartment community that needs help with summer lunches. It is a mixed-income property with a built-in summer and afterschool program (New Life Alliance). Because of its relatively remote location and small numbers of kids they are serving, (around 20), the school district can't serve them summer meals. They are grateful for the help we've been giving with shelf-stable food items for meals for the summer program.

Right now, Red Oak really needs individual snack items: peanut butter and jelly packages, pretzels, applesauce, packets of cheese crackers, etc. We hope you will pick up some snack items for the children at Red Oak and place them in the basket at the front door of the sanctuary on Sunday, August 5, our last summer Gathering.

Helping our neighbors in Waco

A NEW volunteer opportunity here in the neighborhood!

A teacher from next door at Mountainview Elementary asked us if anyone at Lake Shore would be interested in working on a volunteer project. She said, "I'm learning how important it is that children find just the right book for them, one that is both interesting and not too hard, not too easy for them to read. The good news is that I have a well-developed classroom library. The bad news is that it can be a challenge for me to get the right book to the right kid because I don't know the reading level of each book in my classroom library."

"I just attended an International Literacy Association conference in Austin, and found out about a database that exists where you can plug in the title of a book and it spits out the reading level!!! Would anyone at your church be interested in typing in book titles, and writing down the level provided inside the front cover of the book? I have about 12 tubs of books, so you can see why I'm a bit overwhelmed...But this would truly benefit my classroom!"

Solid Gold Neighbor School Supply Drive

You may have heard about the new Transformation Zone that has been set up for the five schools that have been working to become successful places of learning. The NAACP, the National Sorority of Phi Delta Kappa, Restoration Haven, Saved and Successful and other groups are partnering with the Baylor University Solid Gold Neighbor Program (under the leadership of Ramona Curtis) to provide school supplies for the five schools. It is called the Solid Gold Neighbor School Supply Drive.

We want to provide school supplies for *every child* at the five schools — Brook Avenue, J.H.Hines, Alta Vista, Indian Spring, and G.W. Carver— for the *whole school year*. The Solid Gold Neighbor working committee determined that it will cost just \$30 per child to provide supplies for the entire year. If we all chip in, we can do this!

Nanette by Hannah Gadsby was another wonderful Movie Night at LSBC. I laughed, I shed a tear, I got angry, I felt compassion and I got quiet. Hannah Gadsby combines everything worth listening to--truth, pain, enlightenment, and her own brand of joy, wrapped loosely, poignantly and powerfully in humor. Hannah's storytelling allowed us to review and reflect on our personal experiences and/or traumas. As heard during our small and large group discussions, poignant and profound stories and comments were shared. Some thought



provoking comments included: "I wonder if I am insensitive to others." "Have my actions disrespected someone" "Have my faith statements/actions convinced someone to leave this church?" "There is a spectrum of faith, from fundamentalist to progressive, interpretation such as 'love the sinner, but hate the sin,' you can have it both ways." "Lake Shore permits us to question and delve into our faith journey," and "Lake Shore promotes a positive environment of Love, which builds up, and encourages each other."

Movie Night at Lake Shore is a safe and enjoyable evening to review topics and discuss the film's thought-provoking content in regards to how it affects us, how our actions affect others, and how it applies to our life journeys with Christ. I encourage all to attend LSBC Movie Nights; you have an opportunity to meet people, discuss current issues, share your thoughts and story ... and have a free bag of popcorn, too.
