The Context of Our City

September 19, 6:15-7:15

"Hunger . . . within three feet or so"
Buddy Edwards, Executive Director, Caritas

In Waco, 27.5% of families with children live below the poverty rate. The vision of Caritas is to eliminate hunger in McLennan County, Texas, by providing direct services through its food pantry as well as through advocacy, while working with other hunger relief programs in Central Texas. Last year Caritas served 24,000 people with supplemental food assistance.

Buddy Edwards, Executive Director of Caritas, will be coming to talk about the things Caritas is doing currently, including an update on any changes that have occurred in its work.

Before coming to Caritas as Associate Director in 2007, Buddy worked for 29 years at Hillcrest Hospital as the Director of Planning and Research and Grants Officer. He became Executive Director in 2008. Buddy served on the agency's public relations committee since the mid 1980's and was Chairperson of the committee since 2002. He represents Caritas on the Waco-McLennan County Hunger Coalition.

A lot of Lake Shore folks know him best because he performs with the 50's-60's musical group "The Morticians."

Family Abuse Center

We need people to sort clothing donations (then hang them up in categories), fill in holes in clients' rooms and re-paint, weed whack and tidy up grounds at shelter, steam clean carpeted areas.

Gospel Café

Clean the kitchen and the meeting house at the Gospel Café, a mission that serves about 200 lunches, free or at reduced cost, three days a week.

Habitat for Humanity

Team will work at two sites: at the ReStore, assisting with customers and carry out, and at a building site, painting and hanging siding. Hard hats, gloves, and volunteer forms on site. Must be at least 16-years-old

Meals on Wheels

Package dog and cat food for clients' pets. Work will happen here at Lake Shore. The team will get help from the children who will be here.

Salvation Army

Work inside and outside at Sally's House, a homeless shelter for families. We will deep clean the Salvation Army kitchen next door, weed flower beds and spruce up of the yard. Bring gloves.

The Cove

Our work will be painting inside, tending to the flowerbeds outside, and then assembling raised flower beds. Chris adds: "These youth are as worthy of beautiful space to live in and feel welcomed in as any child is! This can be our way of helping craft that space, which can be a place of comfort and shelter in a world that they likely feel is largely against them."

Talitha Koum

Talitha Koum's goal is to partner with parents to send preschoolers who have grown up in poverty into public school kindergarten with: brains organized for learning, the emotional strength to self-regulate, problem solving skills, and compassion for others. Our morning will be spent doing some classroom sanitizing and organization, but mostly helping paint a mural outside.

Lake Shore Baptist Children's Center

Our projects — all of which that support our daily mission to parents and preschoolers — will include everything from cleaning the downstairs windows to planting a raised bed garden on the playground.

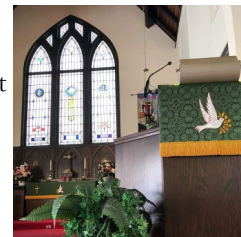

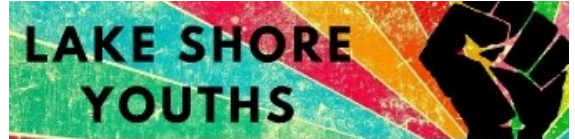
