Last Friday night our parents of youth & children gathered to share a meal and talk through how we approach dealing with tough topics in the Bible with our kids. We

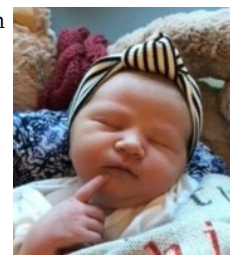
