## Thursday morning in Chengdu Wednesday night in Waco

Skyping with the Ramirezzes  
October 17 at 6:15 pm CST



The night we will Skype with them the Ramirezzes will mark one year since they arrived in Chengdu, China, on October 17, 2017. Join us next Wednesday at 6:15 pm Waco time as we visit with the Ramirezzes on Thursday morning at 7:15 am Chengdu time. They may be eating a Sichuan breakfast. They may be walking Juniper to school. Or they may still be in their pajamas. Pull up a chair to talk with them!

Chengdu is the capital city of Sichuan Province and a rapidly growing city and gateway to western China. It is home to Sichuan Theological Seminary, the China Christian Council seminary for all of Southwest China where pastors and church leaders are trained. Christianity is growing so quickly in China that there is a large gap in the number of trained pastors/lay leaders and the number of people seeking to grow in understanding of the Gospel. The Ramirezzes are developing relationships with local church leaders to provide coaching, training and assistance in developing new areas of ministry and enhancing ongoing church ministries. As they learn Mandarin Chinese, they are investing in a long-term commitment to the ongoing ministries and relationships in the Sichuan Province. As they acquire a deeper understanding of the needs in local churches, they are able to better partner with Chinese Christians and engage CBF churches with the mission of God in Chengdu.

## Children's Center Reading Time October 23, 9:30am-10:00am

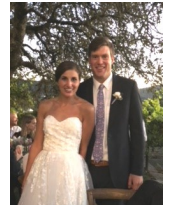
