The holy gift of the Incarnation does not come in grand gestures. It is a pure gift of grace that comes every once in a while -- even amidst the rush and stress of our daily lives and the whirlwind of news that seems to send parts of our world, even parts of ourselves, over the edge every day. As you focus on "All Is Calm" this Advent season -- especially in this world that aggravates fear and stress -- look for the clear, quiet ways Christ comes to you.

It is right and good—that in the midst of the rush and celebrations, the noise and the news, the excess and the unimaginable—that we seek a space away from the activity of the world for a little while each day. We pray that quiet can come upon us, like it settled upon Mary, so that we can reflect on all that we have seen and heard. Calm reflection will sustain us as we become agents of God's peace in the world.

Each year members of our congregation write Advent meditations to guide us through the season. We give thanks for the writers who took the time to prepare for Advent even before its liturgical beginning on December 2. They paid attention to things that calmed their hearts or remembered things that caused them to dearly long for the spirit of calmness and peace. They expressed themselves in memories, prayers, poems, and guided meditations. Some of the writers are new contributors to this traditional Lake Shore book. A few worshiped with us here at Lake Shore until moving away a few years ago, but we always welcome their insights.

"All Is Calm" -- we seem to need the words now more than ever. May these meditations help us claim this prayerful aspiration as we live attentive to Christ's incarnation.

Advent Missions Tree

Every year we decorate two trees — the Chrismon ("Christ monograms") Tree in our sanctuary and the Missions Tree in our hall. On the first Sunday of Advent, more than a hundred Christmas ornaments will hang on the Missions Tree. Our missions covenant groups have chosen projects that will benefit ministries in Waco and around the world. On the back of each one you'll find a description of a missions project. Stop by the tree before or after Sunday School or worship. Choose a project you want to do this Advent season, sign the numbered tag that says "All Is Calm," and rehang it on the tree. Take the other ornament home to hang on your tree. On the first Sunday of Advent, please choose only one ornament, so everyone will have a chance to get one. You may get more ornaments the next Wednesday or Sunday. The list below gives *samples* of the Missions Tree projects.

Community Missions Projects

Meals on Wheels

In our church kitchen we package and deliver meals to more than fifty individuals three days a week as we partner with Meals and Wheels to help meet the needs of older adults.

• Purchase a large package of adult incontinence briefs for a Meals on Wheels client.

The Cove

The Cove is a teen nurturing center designed to provide a safe space for students experiencing homelessness to access the resources they need to thrive.

- Purchase 2 or more packages of Dubble Bubble Original Flavor Individually Wrapped bubble gum.
- Purchase a Swiffer Wetjet Spray Mop Floor Cleaner Starter Kit.

Family Abuse Center

The purpose of the center is to minister to women and children who have suffered physical abuse.

- Purchase a toaster for a Family Abuse Center client who is getting ready to move into a new home.
- Purchase board games for the Family Abuse Center's activity room.

Talitha Koum Institute

TKI is a faith-based organization, providing a mental health therapeutic Nurture Center that offers brain development and all-day loving care to at-risk children from eight weeks old to kindergarten.

- Give a Tonka Toughest Mighty Dump Truck.
- Purchase a Little Tikes Gas 'n Go Mower for the children at Talitha Koum.

Mission Waco/Mission World Meyer Center

Mission Waco's purpose is to provide holistic relation-based ministry with the poor and marginalized in inner-city Waco, as well as throughout the world, including Church Under the Bridge and the Meyer Center.

 Purchase 2 or more pairs of men's outdoor mid-toheavyweight wool socks for a homeless client.

Lake Shore Baptist Children's Center

Our center is a source of nurture and preschool education and a steady place in the lives of working families.

- Give a Fisher-Price nativity set for one of the classes in our Center.
- Give \$20 or more for preschool books for one of the classes in our Center.

Global Missions Projects

Song for Shalom, Ghana

With Lake Shore's support, Christiana Owusu started a preschool in Ghana. Now in its fifteenth year, Shalom feeds and educates more than 300 children in Twifu-Hemang, a rural village in Ghana. Most parents can afford to pay only part of the cost for a child.

• Give \$30 per chair to help furnish classrooms.

Lebanese Society for Educational & Social Development

In 2015 and again in 2018 Lake Shore's Soup Supper benefitted Syrian refugees, living in Lebanon, by buying boxes of food for families. LSESD's mission is "to serve the church in the Arab world through spiritual, social and educational development."

• Give \$50 or more to assist the LSESD with meeting the urgent needs of the displaced and vulnerable families in the Mena region.

Cooperative Baptist Fellowship

CBF Field Personnel serve within three primary contexts: global poverty, global migration, and the global church. This year we are giving to these two areas of ministry:

• China

To help Brittany and Casey Ramirez's work in China.

Puerto Rico

In cooperation with Iglesia Bautista de Metropolis, Carolina, Puerto Rico, give \$40 or more to assist in building temporary classrooms for children where recovery work continues in the aftermath of Hurricanes Maria and Irma.

Nsam Baptist Church, Cameroon

Nsam Baptist Church in Cameroon is Henry Kari's home church; his mother and other family members are still active in the church. Historically, the building has been a place for worship for the people of the congregation. It is a sanctuary, offering a safe place when groups of villagers, Christians and Muslims alike, gather to discuss matters of importance to all the people of Nsam. Its roof and foundation are in great need of repair.

• Give \$50 or more for the renovation of Nsam Baptist Church.

Interfaith Welcome Coalition, San Antonio

San Antonio Interfaith Welcome Coalition volunteers meet refugee women and children upon their arrival and give them support through clothes, food, hygiene kits, and a welcoming presence before the next leg of their journey.

 Purchase some of the following items to share with immigrant children seeking asylum in the United States: small Hot Wheels or Matchbox cars, coloring books for very young children, small boxes of crayons, bilingual board books, gloves or mittens.

Christian Mission to Gaza

For many years we have partnered with pastor Hanna Massad to help in his ministries to Gaza for the people who suffer immense troubles. In addition to preaching at Gaza Baptist Church, he helps Palestinians — both Christians and Muslims — with their daily emergency needs.

- Assist a family with medical costs by giving \$50 or more for their daughter's treatment.
- Give \$60 or more to help feed a Palestinian family in Gaza for one month.

This year's ornaments

This year we purchased our ornaments from Blue Sheep in Chengdu, China. Blue Sheep buys its products from skilled artisans who either live in remote areas or have been restricted by illness, poverty, a disability and disaster, and sells them to a larger market. Many are traditional handicrafts made by minority ethnic groups, such as the Miao. The profits are returned to the artisans, to their community, or to a particular area of need. This ensures artisans are given a fair price and protects China's diverse and traditional customs. Blue Sheep is also involved in relief work in which profits are used to benefit the producer, their communities or others in need as



in post-disaster situations. Blue Sheep has provided food and bedding, solar lights, first aid equipment and rabbits to farmers after earthquakes, floods, and landslides. It has also, supplied books for community libraries and scholarships for the education of poor students, and it has helped to build dormitories, kitchen, and incinerators and toilets for schools serving one of China's minority ethnic groups.
