

Deryl Fleming, Lake Shore's Third Fulltime Pastor, to Speak in Sunday School

Bereshith class room at 9:30 a.m. Coffee and breakfast snacks at 9:15

Deryl Fleming, who pastored here from 1967 to 1974, is in Waco this week to offer a homily at the memorial service for his good friend Bill Carden. Since 2019 is Lake Shore's 60th anniversary year, we didn't want to miss the chance to get to know Deryl, a Lake Shore minister many call a "pastoral poet."

Deryl came to Lake Shore in

1963 as Assistant Pastor when Rhea Gray was pastor. When Gray resigned in 1967, Fleming served as interim. As Rufus Spain wrote in the first edition of the Lake Shore history: "Fleming's theology and his views of the role of the church in the modern world were essentially the same as Gray's; hence the program and direction for the church changed little. But his low-key style and conciliatory manner brought the church together and made his ministry unique. . . . Through his unique qualities of leadership and example, through sermons laden with spiritual, intellectual, and social challenge, and by his skillful direction of the educational program of the church, Fleming had led Lake Shore members toward more community involvement, more appreciation of their Christian heritage, greater ecumenical awareness, and a fuller appreciation of 'Life as Gift' to be lived to the fullest."

After leaving Lake Shore, Fleming served as pastor of Ravensworth Baptist Church in Annandale, Virginia, and as chaplain at Brook Lane, Hagerstown, MD. Even in his retirement, Deryl has continued to minister part-time and to worship at Burke Presbyterian Church.. (see picture above)

Lord God, as we look back at 2018, we are reminded of too many occurrences of unnecessary pain, suffering, and injustices in our global community.

Joanne may address the question, "How has the balance in the region been affected by the planned withdrawal of the U. S. from Syria and the planned cut-back in Afghanistan?"

She may also tell us what it's like to live in Baghdad in 2018-2019 and answer the question, "What does everyday life look like right now?" And she will certainly be glad to respond to the questions you ask.
