We are happy to share some exciting news with you! Recently, we were notified of a significant gift to Lake Shore from the estate of Deborah Harris. The total gift is in excess of \$800,000.

Many of you will remember Deborah as a talented, generous woman who loved Lake Shore. Her music, writing, prayers, and kindnesses were an inspiration to many and continued even through her last battle with mesothelioma. She died on November 28, 2016.

Deborah also generously remembered Caritas, Seeds, Talitha Koum, and her family in her will. We are so grateful to Deborah for this gift, and our gratitude extends to her brother, Ron Harris, and sister, Ruth Ann Borrowman.

The obvious question is how will we use it to meet the short term and long term needs of our church in a way that is compatible with our values and Deborah's memory?

To this end, we will be putting together an *ad hoc* task force to collect and consider recommendations. The committee will be made up of a diverse group of leaders from our various church committees. We will provide more information on this in the near future.

Race, Gender, and Image Repair Theory: How Digital Media Change the Landscape

At our Wednesday night seminar, Dr. Moody-Ramirez will talk with us about her latest book: Race, Gender, and Image Repair Theory: How Digital Media Change the Landscape.

Mia Moody-Ramirez, Ph.D., is a Professor and Director of Graduate Studies in the Department of Journalism, Public Relations and New Media at Baylor, and is also Director of American Studies in the Baylor College of Arts & Sciences.

She is Vice Head of the Minorities and Communication Division and Secretary for the Commission on the Status of Women. She served on the Association for Education in Journalism and Mass Communication Strategic Plan Implementation Committee from 2013 to 2016. She completed the Scripps Howard Academic Leadership Academy at LSU in 2014. She was the recipient of the third-annual Baylor University Diversity Award. She is a 2016-17 Academy of Teaching & Learning Baylor Fellow.

Her research emphasizes mass media representations of women, minorities and other underrepresented groups. In 2013, she co-authored *The Obamas and Mass Media: Race, Gender, Religion, and Politics.* Her journalism experience includes working as a blogger, staff writer and columnist for the *Waco Tribune-Herald*, editor and publisher of *FOR Seasons* magazine and *Elegant Woman* magazine and managing editor for Stevens Publishing.

She received her B.A. in journalism from Texas A&M University, M.A. in journalism from Baylor University, M.S. in Educational Psychology, and her Ph.D. in journalism from the University of Texas at Austin.


