Harris Gift Committee Recommendations Approved

At the Church Business Meeting held on June 5, the congregation discussed the report from the Harris Gift Committee that had been subsequently approved by the Deacons.

The report was developed in response to the Committee's charge "to make recommendations to the Deaconate on the appropriate use of the Harris Estate Gift with careful consideration of the church's short and long term financial needs, values and priorities, as well as the memory and legacy of Deborah Harris." All of the Committee's recommendations in the report were approved with one modification. The Committee had recommended short-term funding of \$50,000 as an emergency building reserve for unexpected maintenance issues. The congregation felt that there were pressing maintenance issues related to areas used by our children and youth, and voted to use the funds for these purposes.

Now that the Harris Gift Committee's work has been completed, it has been dissolved. However, we all owe a debt of gratitude to those who served on the Committee: Katy Abel, Kay Avant, David Davis, Magi Davis, Steve Gardner, Beverly Hill, Henry Kari, Mike Raymond, Kyndall Rothaus, Sharlande Sledge, Don SoRelle, and Chris Williamson.

And most importantly, we owe our deepest thanks and appreciation to Deborah Harris and her family.

His book *Psalms as a Grammar for Faith* is scheduled to be out in October. Bill looks forward to research leave in North Carolina in the fall semester.

deeply rooted in CBF life., is the nominee to become the next Moderator-Elect for the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship at the 2019 General Assembly in Birmingham this month.

Carol was community minister at First Baptist Church, Knoxville, TN (2005-2012) and Christian education minister at Church of the Holy Comforter in Augusta, GA, before moving to Columbia in 2012.

She is a graduate of Truett Seminary where she earned her M. Div. and M.S.W. in 2003. While in seminary, McEntyre served as ministerial assistant at Lake Shore from 2001-2003. We ordained her here in 2002.

Carol is a graduate of Carson-Newman University in Jefferson City, TN, earning her bachelor of arts in

human services and psychology. She has a doctor of ministry from Drew University in Madison, NJ. Carol has received numerous honors and awards that recognize her passion for congregational ministry and her commitment to Cooperative Baptist life, including CBF’s Young Baptist Award in 2015. She completed the Center for Congregational Health’s Young Leader’s Program and is a graduate of the inaugural class of CBF Fellows (2012-2015). She has served on the Leadership Team for Baptist Women in Ministry (2015-2018) and is currently a member of the CBF Governing Board.

Carol expresses excitement about stepping into her new role. “This is an opportunity for me to give back to a community that has invested in my ministry from the beginning. When I was a student at Truett, I received a scholarship from CBF, which helped cover a portion of my tuition and provided the opportunity to attend General Assembly. Having grown up in a church that didn’t support women in ministry, as I pursued my calling, CBF became a place of acceptance and encouragement. When I finally had the opportunity to become a senior pastor, CBF was there again investing in me through the CBF Fellows program.

“Throughout my ministry, the

churches that I have served benefitted from their partnership with CBF and the chance to support and engage with CBF field personnel around the world... This connection has enriched the life of our church. As I look toward the role of moderator, I recognize that churches are facing many challenges and need the camaraderie and creativity of the Fellowship surrounding them. I look forward to working with new Executive Coordinator Paul Baxley and the wider Fellowship to face this new day together.”

Carol and her husband, Michael, who is also a minister, are parents to their two children: Nate, 9, and Marin, 4.

At Carol’s ordination council, Rufus Spain asked her: “How do you keep such a clear head and calm presence?” And she answered, “I have to carve out time to be still and centered, a space where God is, and as I move in the world, that space surrounds me.” As Carol’s family and pastoral life continues to grow, may we keep learning from her how to live in the world.
