Missions Tree

The response to the Missions Tree this year is great! After only two Sundays of Advent, 77 ornaments have already been chosen from the wall and



put on the tree. The number of gifts under the tree for community ministries and checks in the office for global ministries are arriving at the church. You are choosing to open "windows of light" for Waco and the world this Advent season.

Twenty-three star ornaments are still on the tree, some for each of the ministries we're helping. Within every category, a few ornaments are still available. Community ministries ornaments are available in Talitha Koum, Meals on Wheels, The Cove, Lake Shore Baptist Children's Center, Family Abuse. Global ornaments are available for Shalom Children's Center, Lebanese Society for Social and Economic Development, Christian Mission to Gaza, CBF China, and American Gateways.

We started with ten projects for each organization. Each of the one hundred projects costs about \$25 each. If you choose a project which asks you to write a check or pay by card, we hope you will consider giving more.
