During the eighth century, the church began observing Ash Wednesday, the first day of Lent, as a solemn day of confession. The name Ash Wednesday comes from the sign of ashes that the worshipers receive on their foreheads as an act of repentance and a symbol of mortality. We hope you will join us for this service of prayer, silence, hymns, and confessions, as once more we each hear the words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

and the stars that blaze in our bones,


and the galaxies that spiral inside the smudge we bear.

Having graduated from Baylor with a bachelor's degree in psychology, Mike earned his medical degree from The University of Texas Medical Branch in Galveston and completed his residency and fellowship training at the University of Kentucky Medical Center where he also served as Chief Resident in the Department of Medicine. Dr. Attas is Board certified in Internal Medicine with a subspecialty in cardiovascular disease. Most of his professional career has been here in Waco with Cardiology Associates.

Alongside his career in medicine, Dr. Attas earned a Master of Divinity with an emphasis in ethics and moral theology from the Episcopal Theological Seminary of the Southwest in Austin. He is an ordained priest, serving for several years as an assisting priest at Waco's St. Paul's Episcopal Church. In 1999, Dr. Attas combined his passions for medicine and spirituality to direct the Medical Humanities program at Baylor, a program designed to foster an understanding of the spiritual, ethical, economic, and literary aspects of health care.

He has also taught at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center in Dallas, the Department of Medicine at Texas A&M University Health Science Center, Baylor College of Medicine, the University of Wyoming College of Medicine & Family Practice, and the University of Colorado Medical School.
