We welcome Michael Attas back to Lake Shore tonight. He was last here when he preached for us on Christ the King Sunday in November.

Mike graduated from Baylor with a B.A. in psychology and then earned his medical degree from The University of Texas Medical Branch in Galveston and completed his residency and fellowship training at the University of Kentucky Medical Center where he also served as Chief Resident in the Department of Medicine. Dr. Attas is board certified in internal medicine with a subspecialty in cardiovascular disease. Most of his professional career has been here in Waco with Cardiology Associates.



Alongside his career in medicine, Dr. Attas earned a Master of Divinity with an emphasis in ethics and moral theology from the Episcopal Theological Seminary of the Southwest in Austin. He is an ordained priest, serving for several years as an assisting priest at Waco's St. Paul's Episcopal Church. In 1999, Dr. Attas combined his passions for medicine and spirituality to direct the Medical Humanities program at Baylor, a program designed to foster an understanding of the spiritual, ethical, economic, and literary aspects of health care.

He has also taught at the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center in Dallas, the Department of Medicine at Texas A&M University Health Science Center, Baylor College of Medicine, the University of Wyoming College of Medicine & Family Practice, and the University of Colorado Medical School. Mike and his wife, Gail, enjoy traveling, especially to locations where Mike can fly-fish. Mike and Gail are parents of three children: Jason, Jessica, and Amanda.

Welcome to Waco, Suzii New Director of Prosper Waco Wednesday Night Seminar March 18 — 6:15 pm

Next week Suzii Paynter March will speak about her new venture as the CEO of Prosper Waco, helping the organization's mission of improving education, health and financial security for all members of the Waco community. Suzii says, "Prosper Waco convenes dozens of community partners, finds strengths in our community, uses the best data to move the needle toward progress and supports many dedicated Waco leaders who

In early 2019, Suzii was honored as a recipient of the Baylor Distinguished Alumni Award, having served six years as the executive director of the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship and most recently as co-director of Pastors for Texas Children. Earlier she directed the BGCT's Texas Baptist Christian Life Commission and the Advocacy Care Center. A reading specialist, she taught at Baylor when she was at Lake Shore in the 1980s. Her countless honors and experiences include ordination to the gospel ministry at Austin Heights Baptist Church in Nacogdoches in 2017. We, too, bless her ministry.

And at Lake Shore we're so glad that one of Suzii's new colleagues at Prosper Waco is Emily Hunt Hinojosa, Director of Research and Community Impact.

New Deacon Ministry

In early 2019, the deacons began looking at the New Testament's calling to deacons to care for others as part of their service. At their 2020 retreat last weekend, the deacons adopted the following guidelines for Lake Shore's new Deacon Family Ministry:

Purpose:

- To promote a sense of belonging in the church for all participants
- To help deacons get to know the members better, learn about their needs
- To provide pastoral care to church members and identify to the ministerial staff individuals who need pastoral care.

Responsibilities:

- Regular communication with each person or family at least every two months and report to the Deacon Board at least once a quarter to provide some accountability. Person to person or phone calls are preferred but emails, texts or cards would be OK occasionally
- Provide pastoral care as able for church members and identify individuals who need pastoral care to the pastoral staff i.e., illnesses, hospitalizations, losses, special needs
- Respond to critical needs with hospital visits, home visits, phone calls and cards as needed

If you are currently an active part of Lake Shore, anticipate a contact from a deacon within the next two months. Each of the 21 deacons will contact nine family units. The new Deacon Ministry Groups replace the Care Groups, though the new groups are significantly smaller.



A Case Against Hunger

Here's how it works:

• The Caritas covenant group orders cases of food that will be delivered to Lake Shore.

- You may purchase food before and after Sunday School, after worship, and before Wednesday night supper.
- You may choose between canned meats, cereal, canned vegetables, rice, peanut butter, and pasta. Children may purchase macaroni & cheese by the box rather than by the case.
- Caritas will pick up the food Lake Shore has purchased to help fill the shelves.

The Mission of Caritas is "to provide urgent support to people in need in our community through emergency assistance with food, prescription drugs, clothing, household items and utilities and through two thrift stores." — *Caritas Covenant Group*
