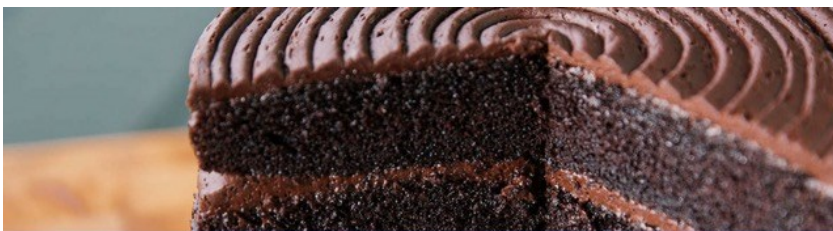

Easter Walk was a Success!

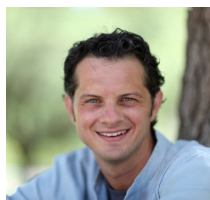

The Enneagram: A Tool for Christian Spiritual Formation

Our leader for the workshop is Jon Singletary, dean of the Diana R. Garland School of Social Work at Baylor University.

He has been an advocate of spiritual disciplines for many years and has studied the Enneagram for the past 10 years. He has been studying as an apprentice with Enneagram Teacher, Suzanne Stabile, for the past three years. Jon says:

“The workshop is a daylong opportunity to learn about the Enneagram as a tool, each of the nine personality types it represents, and where you fit within it.

“The Enneagram is an ancient tool focused on understanding personality characteristics for the purpose of spiritual formation. There are many tools and approaches to understanding personality these days. From Myers-Briggs and StrengthsFinder, to Hartman’s colors and Smalley’s animals, there are innumerable tools that can be

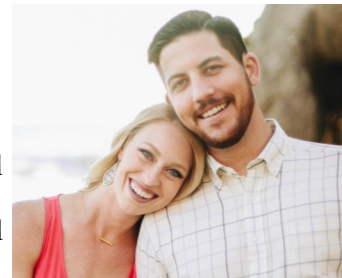
used for self-awareness and personal growth. Many of these also have community and organizational implications. Few have the inherent spiritual dimension of the Enneagram.

“Theories of personality usually have to do with our behavioral, cognitive and emotional responses to life situations. In other words, we each have patterns of thinking, feeling, and doing that make us unique. Understanding these patterns can have value for us socially, psychologically, and spiritually.

“Spiritual transformation is a common goal for people who believe that our faith practices can enrich and enhance our spiritual lives. Come hear about the Enneagram as a tool for this journey.”
