Worship Notes

Today is Pentecost Sunday. Pentecost falls on the 50th day after Easter. Celebrated first as part of the Feast of Weeks in which devout Jews gathered in Jerusalem, Pentecost is the third great festival of the Christian year, in addition to Christmas and Easter and marks the coming of the Holy Spirit to Jesus’ followers. For that reason Pentecost is often called the “birthday of the church.” The feast day of Pentecost remembers a day not long after Jesus’ resurrection when the energy of the Spirit was poured out in power upon the Church. The color for Pentecost is red, signifying the flames of the Spirit as it descended in the books of Acts. It was a unifying Spirit that crossed the artificial boundaries of language, race and culture. People could speak and be understood; strangers heard one another; communion happened. The Spirit breathes peace. Here’s what seems to happen when people allow this divine Spirit to energize them: Love, joy, peace, long-suffering, kindness, goodness, faith, meekness and self-control. We call that the ‘fruit of the Spirit.’ It’s a description of the qualities of Jesus. That’s who we are and whom we are to become.”
